Update on the Budget Shortfall

We've reduced the Financial Shortfall by half; time extended for others to participate too!

Your Vestry has committed to overcome an ongoing yearly financial shortfall which has affected Holy Spirit for several years. You will have heard about this at our Annual Meeting, in letters sent to all parishioners and in announcements during church services. Funding what it actually costs to run the church is doable. If each of our pledging households pledges an additional \$5.30/week (equal to \$275 for the year), the recurring shortfall will be gone. The alternative is to further cut our budget. However, here is no fat in the Holy Spirit budget; simply put, cutting our spending to match our current annual income means deciding which staff positions should be reduced.

Fortunately, the initial results of our effort have produced results: over 50 of our pledging households have stepped forward, and an additional five households have made new pledges. As a result, our shortfall has been reduced by almost 50%. We understand that making an additional pledge is not possible for everyone; others may be able to do more than requested. The Vestry has extended the time period for this critical challenge, to give others the opportunity to support the church that brings so much to us.

EXPLORING PRAYER THROUGH WORD, ART AND MOVEMENT-

Plan to attend this day-long retreat on April 6th here at Holy Spirit. Whether you are new to prayer, or you're looking to refresh your prayer life, this is a fabulous opportunity for all men and women in our parish. Three sessions in the morning will highlight different formats for prayer.
