HOMELESS—On January 31st, Missoula Interfaith Collaborative will hold the city's annual Project Community Connect (formerly called Project Homeless Connect), to offer free food, clothing, and employment, medical and legal services, among other things, to homeless Missoula people-all in one location during one day. Urgently needed are winter clothing items for men and women-especially winter coats, jeans, sweaters, sweatshirts, and long-sleeved shirts. Also sleeping bags and backpacks. There will be a collection bin in the entryway of the church on the coming Sundays in January and in the Church Office during the week for what members can bring in from their own closets and from thrift stores in town.
