This year is important in that the Convention will be held at the end of July instead of October due to the need to elect the next diocesan bishop as well as care for the business of the Diocese. All those wanting to be considered for election as a delegate will need to be available to do two things:

- Attend one of the walkabouts across the diocese sometime about two to three weeks prior to Diocesan Convention where candidates for Bishop who have been put forward by the Nominating Committee and approved by the Standing Committee will travel to talk with delegates and Episcopalians across the Diocese; and
- Will be able to attend the Diocesan Convention July 25-28, 2019 in Bozeman.

Electing the next Bishop of this diocese is an important responsibility of elected delegates on behalf of the entire diocese. If you are able to meet these requirements and would like to be considered for election as a delegate from Holy Spirit Parish, please email Judy Parock, our Parish Administrator, at office@holyspiritmissoula.org by **December 17 at 9 a.m.** to let her know of your interest. She will compile a list of names for our Annual Meeting (January 27, 2019) where a final list of delegates and alternate delegates will be elected.
