Confluence: A new community for young adults

For many years we have observed numerous young adults living in the Missoula area who have a history of growing up in our churches, working at our camps, being involved with campus ministry, and/or even doing a year abroad in the ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission program. We are also aware that most of these folks are not connecting with or attending our local Sunday morning congregations. When asked, however, many express an interest and desire to be part of a young adult faith group. There is a yearning to have a community and sacred space to revision and reclaim their own Christian faith narrative in a way that gives life, builds community, and calls them into the work of service, healing and justice. In our last newsletter I lifted up the possibility of starting young adult small groups with shared leadership and vision.

Since that time, we have had a variety of young leaders come together and start asking the hard questions such as: "What would a group look like that I would want to invite my friends to?" "What would really feed me in a way that I would want to be part of it?" "Could I help be a leader in this?" We now have a core group of about 8 who have been meeting through the fall and are ready to launch a new venture together! This new venture is our attempt to build that group with a model of shared leadership, creativity, and quality programing. Our hope is that this will be a collaboration between Emmaus Campus Ministry and our partner congregations in the Missoula area. We envision this being an extended ministry of those congregations and way for all of us to meet the spiritual needs of this generation.

To start, the name of this new group will be called Confluence. This was picked out of at least 50 names because it suggests a coming together of different people with varied experiences, traditions, stories, passions and skills to combine as a community with more power, love and possibility that anyone can have alone. It also suggests movement and flow and perhaps the acceptance that change and growth will happen to us all.

Confluence is a young adult faith group grounded in Christian traditions and wisdom with a focus on spiritual practice, deeper conversations, social action, and having fun. We start with the basic principle that all people and creation are sacred and deserve dignity, compassion, and the freedom to live a meaningful life. Our work together is to be spiritually grounded, theologically and culturally formed, and deeply connected so that we can be instruments of healing, peace, and justice for all, and especially those who are oppressed in our time and place. Confluence is welcoming and affirming to people of all perspectives, histories and identities.

Meetings: At UCC church; 2nd and 4th Sundays, twice per month (6-8pm), with a launch date of Feb. 12.
