A new study begins in November:

Conversations about Being Mortal

Join Reverend Gretchen, Oncologist Dr. Sally Scott, and Nurse Practitioner Susannah Ries, both members of our parish, for a 3-week class based on the book, Being Mortal: Medicine and What Matters in the End by Atul Gawande. Learn about themes from the book, see clips from the documentary, and learn from the experience of these health care professionals. The class will address finding meaning at the end of life, dealing with the uncertain future. navigating communication with health care providers, and completing and using advance directives. The book will serve as a backdrop for the class, providing examples and context. Reading the book is not a requirement for participation.



Dr. Sally Scott grew up on a horse farm outside of Boston, MA and attended Dartmouth College in New Hampshire. After college she worked for two years as a research assistant in Boston before attending medical school at the University of Massachusetts. She then returned to Dartmouth for three years of residency

training in internal medicine followed by a year as Chief Medical Resident. In 2007, Dr. Scott returned to Boston for her fellowship training in hematology/oncology at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center at Harvard Medical School. She moved to Missoula in 2010 to take a job at Montana Cancer Center.

Nurse Practitioner Susannah Ries received her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Oregon Health & Science University. Following graduation, she worked for several years as a pediatric oncology nurse before finding her home in the special world of neonatal intensive care. After nearly a decade as a bedside NICU nurse Susannah decided to expand her role and responsibilities, earning a Master of Science in Nursing from the University of Texas Arlington.

Reverend Gretchen served as a Hospice chaplain at a freestanding Hospice facility in Branford, CT while working on her Master of Divinity degree. After graduation she helped a small Hospice in Central Oregon develop a bereavement program. After moving to Missoula in 1997 Gretchen worked with Dr. Ira Byock at the Missoula Demonstration Project to seek methods for improving end-of-life care in Missoula. In 2001 Gretchen became the Bereavement Coordinator at Partners in Home Care Hospice, providing grief counseling for patients, families and staff for over eleven years.



Housing Forum set for November 19 at 7 p.m.:

Gimme Shelter: Home Can Be So Far Away

Oh, a storm is threat'ning/ My very life today/ If I don't get some shelter/ Oh yeah, I'm gonna fade away

Just as in the opening lyric of the Rolling Stones' epic anthem, "Gimme Shelter," low-income renters' access to housing is a critical need in Missoula, where real estate prices are soaring, and wages are relatively modest. To learn more about this important issue and possible public and private solutions, Holy Spirit is hosting a forum on Tuesday, November 19, at 7 p.m. in the parish hall.

The forum features Missoula professionals who wrestle daily with the dimensions of this major issue. They include:



- Have been an Episcopalian for at least two years
- Be willing to attend monthly Vestry meetings and special meetings as required
- Be prepared to serve on Vestry ministries
- Be prepared to count Sunday offerings periodically
